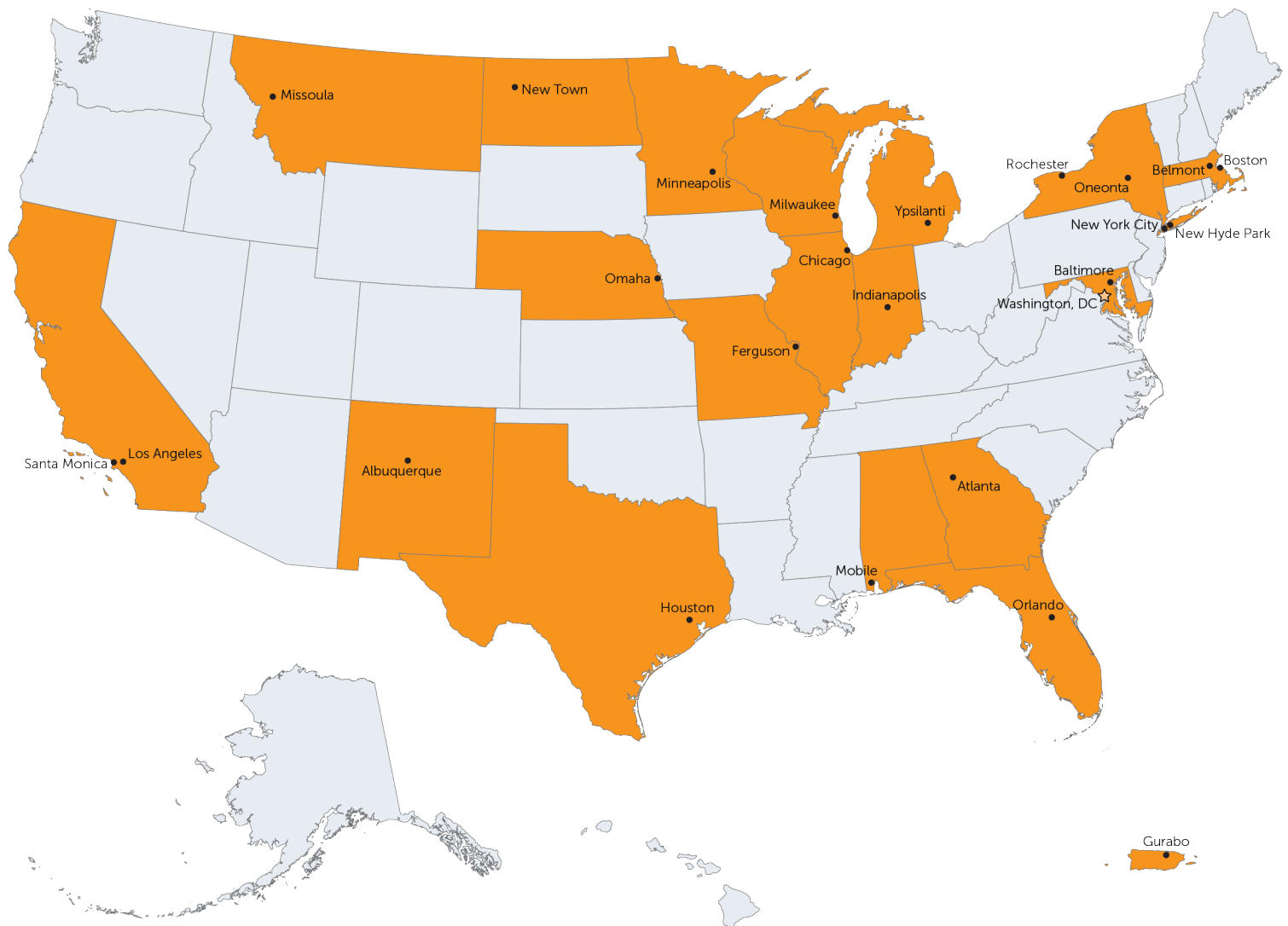


Building a Culture of Health Across the United States

It empowers health care providers to collaborate in teams from a wide range of disciplines—including allied health, dentistry, pharmacy, and veterinary medicine. The teams receive three years of training and funding to take on complex problems in their communities, addressing the social factors that underlie health from their perspectives as both health providers and members of the community.
